## **Information Sheet**

### **Introduction**

The virtual International Workshop on Nuclear Security Detection and Response in Maritime Areas is a joint activity developed with the Global Initiative to Combat Nuclear Terrorism (GICNT). The workshop will include a table-top exercise (TTX) that has been adapted from the IAEA-GICNT collaboration event “Peak of Kinabalu” nuclear detection and response trilateral tabletop exercise held in Malaysia in 2018. The workshop also builds on the lessons learned from the November 2020 Consultancy Meeting on TTX on Nuclear Detection in Shared Maritime Environments, which piloted the materials and tools to conduct a nuclear security TTX virtually, and will include facilitated discussions in virtual working groups and Mentimeter knowledge checks on related topics.

### **Objectives**

The objective of the workshop is to identify and exercise the capabilities required to effectively detect, manage and initiate the response to potential nuclear security threats along maritime borders. Participants in the workshop will:

- 1) Share models for regional and international cooperation during the detection and initial response to a nuclear security event, including the coordination structures, protocols, plans, and resources that link senior decision makers to field operators.

2) Analyze models for initiating and coordinating the deployment of nuclear security detection and response resources in a timely manner.

3) Identify strategies to sustain the capabilities that support nuclear security authorities, including operational personnel, technical experts, senior leaders, and associated protocols and equipment.

## Target Audience

Mid to senior-level officials responsible for national policy related to nuclear security detection and/or response. This may include officials and managers from the coast guard, naval military forces, law enforcement, customs and border security, regulatory authorities, or first responders. Participants should represent Member States with maritime borders and have demonstrated familiarity with their national level plans and procedures related to nuclear detection and response.

Maximum 2 designations per Member State due to limited space availability in working groups.

English

## Participation and Registration

All persons wishing to participate in the event have to be designated by an IAEA Member State or should be members of organizations that have been invited to attend.

In order to be designated by an IAEA Member State, participants are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** to their competent national authority (e.g. Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) for onward transmission to the IAEA by **12 April 2021**. Participants who are members of an organization invited to attend are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** through their organization to the IAEA by above deadline.

Selected participants will be informed in due course on the procedures to be followed with regard to administrative and technical matters.
